

SYNOPSIS

Three actors. Thirty-seven Plays. Ninety Minutes.

This fast-firing comedy does just that as it parodies all of the Shakespeare plays (plus the sonnets!) with only three performers in two acts. This play is full of energy as the characters run across the stage and keep you guessing how they will pull off the next play. Clever use of some interesting costumes also adds to the fun. It's a collaboration of the Marx Brothers, The Three Stooges and Monty Python. Be forewarned, you may find yourself on stage!

A Midsummer Night's Dream, Julius Caesar, Othello, The Tempest and Twelfth Night and of course, Hamlet, I believe were his favorites, but he helped me to really appreciate The Taming of the Shrew and that Scottish play - Macbeth. He taught us how to read, study, and appreciate Shakespeare's work.

As I worked with Lance, Moe, and Jared these last 6 weeks, I tried to instill in them the appreciation and understanding of Shakespeare that I gained as a 16-year-old, or at the very least, to be able to tolerate the works. I think these young men have down a fabulous job grasping the vernacular of 15^a century England. I hope you like it this show and here's to you, Mr Wall – wher-


